Student Accused of Using AI Forced to Defend Worst Discussion Post Ever

GOLDWIN SMITH—Senior Grant Lampert '26 is living every student's worst nightmare. After spending time and energy writing a discussion board post without AI, he has been accused of violating Cornell's generative AI policy.

English Professor Robin Castillo claimed she was immediately suspicious of Lampert's post on Albert Camus's *The Myth of Sisyphus* due to the "unique grammatical choices."

His opening sentence, "Camus—who wrote *The Myth of Sisyphus*—argues in his essay—that essay being *The Myth of Sisyphus*—that one man must imagine Sisyphus

happy," features an alarming amount of em-dashes, a common sign of generative AI usage.

His grammar wasn't the only thing that Castillo flagged. His sentence "Here is a summary of key points from the text," caught Castillo's eye. "It didn't help," she said, "that what followed was thirty-three bullet points all reading 'one must imagine Sisyphus happy.'"

"You can't expect me to write 300 words," defended Lampert. "There's really not that much to say about Camus. Plus, I had to respond to two other people. I can't use all my good points in one post."

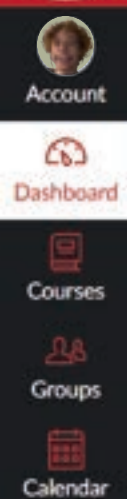
A key point in Lampert's defense was the number of

spelling errors. He claims it is not possible for generative AI to mess up as much as he did.

Castillo rebutted, accusing Lampert of intentionally misspelling words to avoid suspicion. Things got heated when Lampert responded, "Is it possible I'm just stupid?"

The accusations against Lampert were dropped after a thorough review of his writing going all the way back to his freshman year. Because the issues in this discussion board post were consistent with every other thing he's ever written, it was decided there was no cause for alarm.

Lampert says he's "relieved." He will be graduating magna cum laude this year as an English major. ♦

CTB Declares War on Qahwah House, Fires 300 Espresso Shots

COLLEGETOWN—Volleys of espresso shots pounded Qahwah House early Friday morning as CTB fired the opening salvos of a war that threatens to engulf the entire Collegetown restaurant scene.

Bagelian President Augusto Brous declared war on Qahwah House soon after CTB's armed forces launched their caffeinated attack. The invasion, dubbed Operation Panini Press, comes after a breakdown in CTB-Qahwah negotiations over the coffee and pastry trades. Brous, who took power in a Cornell-backed military coup in 1981, has repeatedly called Qahwah House an "illegitimate establishment" and promoted what many culinary rights groups describe as sandwich supremacism.

Souvlaki House, a longtime Bagelian ally, immediately pledged its support to CTB's offensive. "There can only be one restaurant called 'house' in Collegetown," said ruling General Georgios Papachryssanthou, "and it must be based on a medley of Greek, Italian, and American cuisine!" Skirmishes between Souvlaki and Four Seasons troops have already been reported, sparking fears that the restaurant's military government may take advantage of the war to annex their rival across the road. (The Souvlaki junta has frequently espoused anti-barbecue rhetoric and questioned the sovereignty of Four Seasons.)

Many fear that longstanding tensions between Hideaway and Level B may also now break into open warfare. Level B's recent B-listic missile tests have unnerved Hideaway's leadership, who have accelerated their own Blowaway rocket development program. At press time, there have been scattered reports of combat across the Eddy Street demilitarized zone, as well as large-scale movement of bouncers on both sides.

Qahwah President Ali Alhasbani has appealed to Cornellian President Michael Kotlikoff for assistance. While the University has historically maintained close ties with CTB, it is unclear how its leadership will respond to such brazen Bagelian aggression. Cornell's nearby Cascadilla Base has been put on high alert, but Kotlikoff has stated that Cornell must exercise restraint in using its geopolitical voice, and will only intervene in wars that pertain to "its core mission, values or functions." ♦

AXE MURDERER STILL

ON THE LOOSE!

NY STATE POLICE: "PLEASE REMAIN VIGILANT!"

ITHACA, NY—Local authorities issued a warning to citizens of Tompkins, Cayuga, and Seneca counties Sunday night to remain vigilant in the wake of a spree of vicious murders committed by a **SICK AND TWISTED INDIVIDUAL**. In recognition of Wilkins' tireless efforts toward justice and truth, we honor him with this article's leading picture. ♦

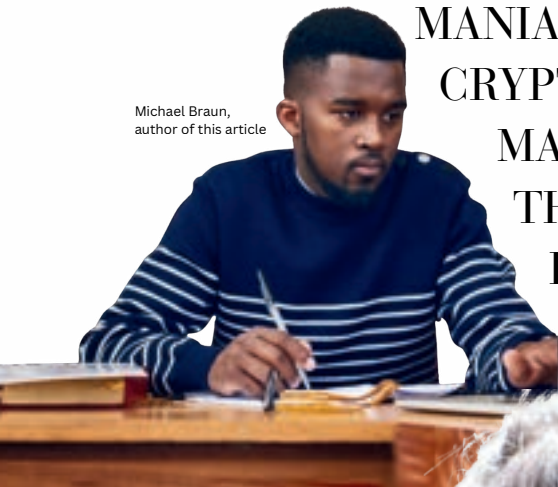

Ryan Lombardi's case is set to be reviewed by an independent faculty senate panel whose members include Marla Love, Christina Liang and Ryan Lombardi. In the event Ryan Lombardi receives a suspension, he is eligible to appeal the decision to Ryan Lombardi.

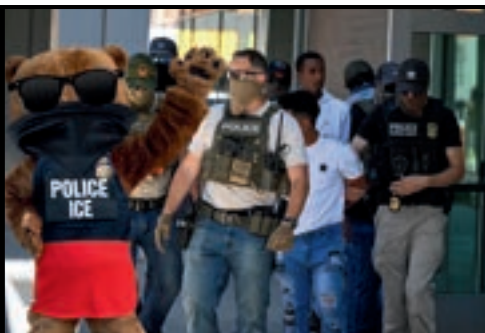

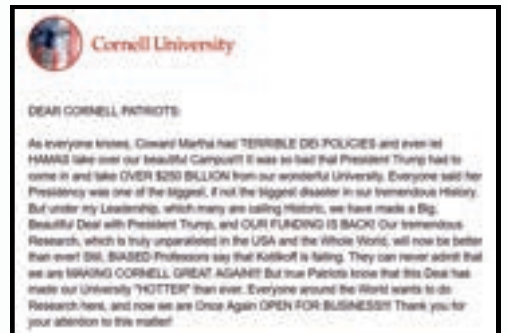

“Bacon, Egg, and Cheese”: Cuomo Seen Practicing Under His Breath Minutes Before Interview

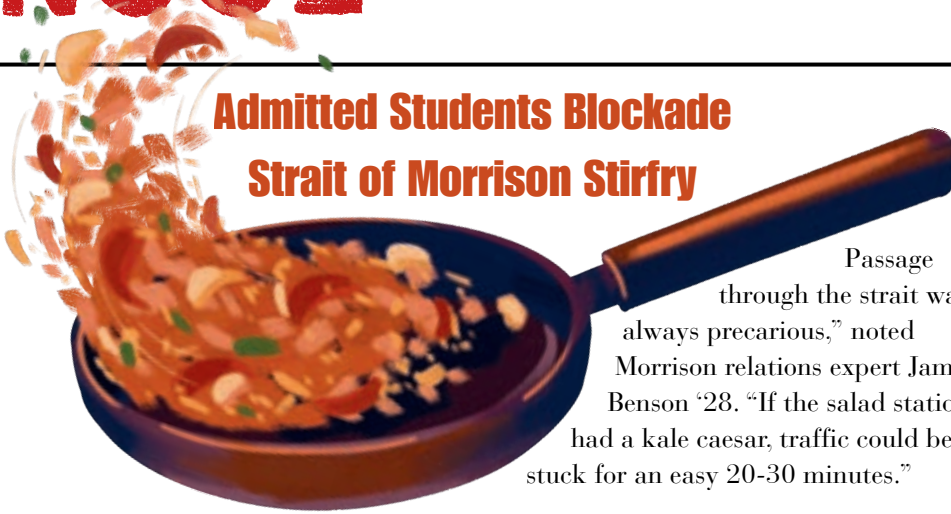

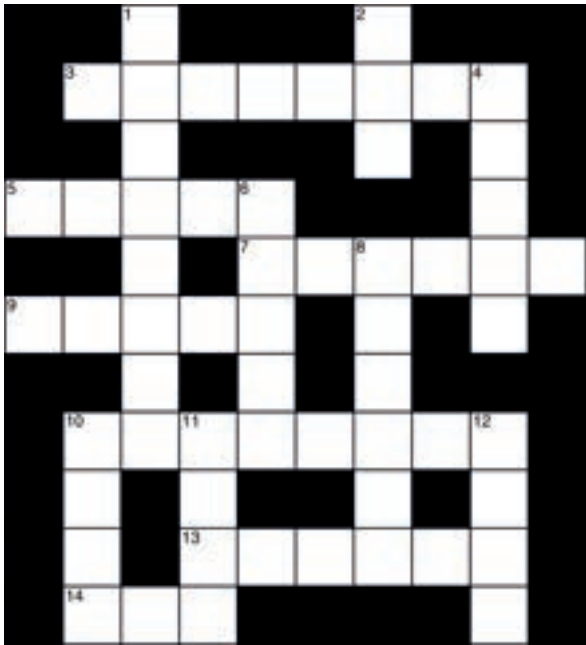

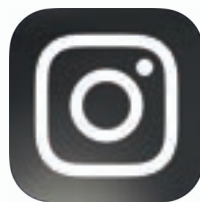


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
